Or talk with anyone who indicates they are a long-time member most of us are happy to answer questions! How can I become an official member of First Parish?

People interested in membership are encouraged to first join a "New UU" class that is usually offered twice a year. Participants learn more about UUism, First Parish, and what membership means, as they get to know each other and explore their own spiritual paths. You don't have to be new to UUism and you don't have to join First Parish afterwards, though you will have that option.

One becomes an official member by "signing the book." New members are invited to participate in an optional membership ceremony during a worship service.

THE GENERALIST MINISTRY TEAM

First Parish is served by the elected leaders, volunteers, and staff. First Parish is also served by two full time ordained ministers. Both ministers preach and participate in worship services and are available for pastoral care, weddings, and memorial services.

Rev. Marta Flanagan is the Lead Minister called by a vote of the congregation in 2009 and is generally called "Marta." Rev. Erica Richmond is the Parish Minister hired by the Parish Committee in August 2020 and is generally called "Rev. Erica." They say their ministry together is grounded in "a sense of a Spirit moving within and among us, service to First Parish, and a call to work for justice, both within and beyond the walls of the meetinghouse."

How do I reach a minister?

Both ministers are available by appointment. For personal, spiritual, and pastoral care, you may choose whichever minister with whom you would like to meet. Pastoral conversations are confidential, but the content of conversations shared with one minister may be shared with the other. Who does what?

Each minister serves as the ministerial contact for various groups and committees at First Parish as well as supervisor to other staff members. Each year, the ministry team divides among themselves the responsibilities for ministry at First Parish. RELIGIOUS EDUCATION AT FIRST PARISH

Our religious education program (a.k.a. "RE") nurtures the spiritual growth and community life of children (nursery through middle school) and youth (high school). Rev. Stevie Carmody, Minister of Religious Education, oversees this program, alongside the Religious Education Committee (a group of lay volunteers elected by the congregation). To get in touch with Stevie, email *mre@firstparish.info*. Note that a separate program supports adult religious education, called "STAR"

Infants and Toddlers

We love the sounds of babies and welcome them in our worship services. If you would prefer to worship without your small ones, we have a nursery with caring and experienced staff. People of all ages are also welcome to take advantage of the video screen in the vestry (where we have coffee hour) if they want more space to move around.

Pre-K to Grade 7

Children are encouraged to attend the first 10-15 minutes of worship services and to come to the front of the sanctuary during the Time for All Ages. Children pre-K to grade 7 then go to other parts of the building to attend a variety of RE classes led by trained volunteer teachers. Children grade 3 and younger must be delivered to their classroom and picked up at 11:30 a.m. by an adult.

Our RE program is a place where children learn and discuss liberal religious values to help them navigate life's challenges. Adults and children together discuss the big questions of life and ponder spiritual issues. Children make friends of all ages for life, learn to care about others, and grow spiritually and emotionally. They are encouraged to take the values they learn on Sunday mornings back to their homes, schools, and playgrounds. Our hope is to raise children to act beyond the church doors with open eyes and loving hearts.

Our Whole Lives of Sexuality (OWL) and Coming of Age (Grades 7-8)

These programs help our middle-grades youth deepen their faith, put their values into practice, and think deeply about their place

in the world and their aspirations for themselves and our society. OWL is led by a team of trained teachers, while Coming of Age is a rite-of-passage course in which young people work closely with adult mentors. Both programs meet on Sunday evenings.

We do not charge for participation in most of our programs, but there is a fee for OWL and Coming of Age due to additional costs for these special programs. We also ask that families commit to consistent weekly attendance.

Youth Group (Grades 9-12)

Our large and active Youth Group helps high school youth build leadership, form supportive friendships, and serve their wider congregation and community.

Guided by our Youth Group Coordinator, Rose Sawyer-Marsh, the Youth Group is largely youth-led and youth-directed. Youth are elected to a range of leadership positions by their peers.

The Youth Group meets on Sunday evenings, 7:00-8:30 p.m. Each year the youth choose a social action project, alternating between local service projects and a service project to another part of the USA every two years. The Youth Group is open to youth in grades 9–12. Youth must attend a newcomers' orientation to become participants.

COMMITTEES & GROUPS

OFFICERS, GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

The officers and standing committees, in close cooperation with the staff, conduct the basic work of the congregation.

If you might be interested in any of these positions, contact the Leadership Development Committee (LDC) at leadership@firstparish.info and/or talk with the committee's chair(s).

These positions are specified in First Parish's bylaws. Officers and members of standing committees are nominated and elected for three-year terms at the congregation's Annual Meeting each May. The LDC offers a slate of nominees. Nominations, including self-nominations, may also be made from the floor, but people are encouraged to talk with the LDC about their interests. Terms begin and end at Annual Meeting.

At other times of year, the Parish Committee may appoint an individual to a standing committee until the following Annual Meeting at the request of that committee's chair or co-chairs.

The bylaws limit individuals to two consecutive three-year terms on a standing committee unless they receive the approval of the Parish Committee for a third term. Officers and members of the Parish Committee may not serve more than two consecutive three-year terms; they become eligible for re-election at the Annual Meeting a year after their second term ends.

Parish Committee (governing board)

Meets the third Tuesday of each month, year-round with additional meetings as needed. Meetings are open to any First Parish member. The Parish Committee is also known as ParCom.
