Sow Fun!

"Good time to plant seeds, right?" we said to 14 kids in the Bailey Room on a chilly December day. We were met with puzzled stares. Our UU kids know a lot about gardening and used words like "dormant" and "cotyledon" in the discussion that followed. Several of them attend the Thompson School, where raised garden beds are used for ongoing projects. But this project was new to them — and to us.

All the rage in Nature World this winter is planting native seeds in split milk jugs and setting them outside in hopes they will sprout seedlings in spring. Rain and snow seep in through the uncapped top. You can find instructions for this in many places, including https://tinyurl.com/2vmmnrmc.

We had treasure to share for this RE project. In November, the Mystic Charles Pollinator Pathways group visited for a seed swap and hands-on demo about cleaning seeds. It turns out that what we'd always thought of as dried seedheads are just husks that may or may not still hold a zillion tiny seeds. Pollinator Pathways had harvested seedheads, cleaned off the chaff, and funneled thousands of tiny seeds into neatly labeled little packets, which they shared with us. We started with halved jugs donated by UU folks — many thanks! Then the kids scooped soil into the bottom half of each jug and sprinkled in sand and seeds. We had a great selection of native pollinator plants, including ironweed, rose milkweed, partridge peas, panic grass, foxglove beardtongue, gaillardia, butterfly weed, Joe Pye weed, coneflower, blue lobelia, golden Alexander, goldenrod, and bee balm. We taped the milk jugs back together and put them outside. You can see them through the Vestry windows.

It's hard to believe the seeds will survive the plunging temperatures and erratic weather we've been having. We can't guarantee results, and this may just be part of a learning curve. But as a famous poet once said (almost), "Hope is the thing with seed leaves." We're hoping for spring seedlings we can spread and share.

So far we've learned that kids make enthusiastic stewards and that even in a time of cold and dark you can plant seeds by small palmfuls.
