Taking Care of Our Community

Inspired by the way First Parish has pulled together in a year of challenges, this year's Stewardship theme is "Together, Stronger Still." It reflects the collective resilience we have shown in the face of the pandemic, racial violence, and fears of a democracy in decline.

Our campaign is off to a great start! By *The Spire* deadline we had already received pledges of \$310,825, which is 44 percent of our goal of \$705,000. Those pledges represent the generosity of 21 percent of our member households.

We have stood strong, stood at the curb holding signs calling for justice, stood for one another, and stood in faith as a community. Among our many strengths are:

- Attending on-line services and a wealth of spiritual and personal development offerings in greater numbers than we attended in-person offerings last year.
- Ministering well to those facing challenges.
- o Providing our Youth Group with a safe space to demonstrate their resilience and creativity.
- o Learning about the needs of our families who have younger children.

As we all know, it is the responsibility and joy of every one of us to keep First Parish vibrant. Each year we dig deep to make pledges that sustain and enhance our community. Our pledges allow us to continue the good work we do for each other, our neighbors, and in the larger world.

By now everyone should have received a letter requesting a generous pledge. Many will also get a call from a Visiting Steward, who will arrange to meet, probably via Zoom. Please welcome the call and meet with your Visiting Steward. Most people find these meetings to be a meaningful, pleasant opportunity to reflect together on our First Parish experience and the importance of sharing financially in the sustenance of our community.

Perseverance

At our February meeting the Parish Committee decided that we will not resume worship in the Sanctuary until it is safe for all to attend. This means waiting until the state has raised the limits on indoor gatherings to levels that accommodate our whole congregation, until vaccines are widely available, and until the spread of Covid-19 is very low. We are considering September Ingathering as a possible date of return.

Services will continue on Zoom, and this year's summer services will also be on Zoom. We are exploring technology investments to allow us to continue offering Zoom access to services even after we return to in-person worship.

At the February 28 service we kicked off our Stewardship Campaign with the theme "Together, Stronger Still," a reflection of how we have weathered the pandemic and even thrived as a community. Visiting Stewards will be reaching out to many members for their feedback and to discuss pledging. Please welcome their call! Reflections

Going Places

As a performer I used to enjoy traveling about, and found it a pleasant challenge to work in unfamiliar spaces. My favorite places are old buildings with the glorious acoustics of wood walls and plaster ceilings — vintage libraries, historic houses, venerable museums.

One place in particular, 130-year-old Dewey Hall in Sheffield, is completely clad in old wood, creating delightful acoustics. Its low stage, about two feet high, has tin-lined holes along the curved front where the original footlights once held glowing flames.

I've sung on that little stage in a Colonial gown, a Civil War hoopskirt, and other antique clothing, just basking in the perfect setting and the vibrant sound. I am grateful the footlights are no longer aflame, given the hazards of flowing dresses.

Over the years generous folks have put me up for gigs. One of the most memorable is the woman who hosted me for a festival in Connecticut. She e-mailed that she would be staying late at the event, but I could come to her house after my performance, if I liked, and she would leave the door open.

"Don't mind the pit bull," she added. "He's a sweetheart."

Armed only with this advice, I pulled up in the darkness and prepared to face either the jaws of death

or slobbery kisses. The resident pittie barely glanced at me, and we went to sleep without interaction.

Currently anchored safely at home, my Zoom performances keep me sane. I hope that you, too, can enjoy adapting to unexpected conditions!

We have had 31 lead ministers, two assistant ministers, one associate minister, and three interim ministers. The first one, hired in 1739, served for 44 years, and our most recent arrived just this year. Among the ministerial portraits along the back wall in the balcony are a few who served the Universalist church up the street, with whom we merged in 1965.

Some had unlikely names. To maintain his dignity, Rev. William Parrot (with us from 1878 to 1881) pronounced his name à la Française: "Pah-row" — just as British TV's Hyacinth Bucket insisted her name was "Bou-quet."

Rev. Augustus Mendon Lord (1890s) often referred to himself as "The Lord," with a twinkle in his eye. Before he spoke he would sometimes intone, "Thus saith the Lord," which either amused people or made them want to hit him with a collection box (probably a bit of both).
