STAR Programs Abounding!

Adult-education programs at First Parish go by the name of STAR, which stands for Spirit,
Transformation, Adventure, and Reflection. At a recent committee meeting, four of us couldn't remember what the acronym stood for, so we looked it up on the website! After a good laugh, we decided it would be a good idea to let others know what STAR stands for and what we do.

Our mission is to promote and support adult programs to encourage spiritual exploration, cultural understanding, and vibrant community connections. Programming comes in three types:

- Experiences that encourage us to turn inward and engage in deep reflection and sharing — a prayer workshop, discussing a book about loneliness or aging, or exploring spiritual practices.
- "Side by side" offerings that are more about community-weaving — potlucks, game nights, crafting circles, or a walk in the woods.
- Turning outward to the wider community, which may involve social justice work or building understanding of issues and needs outside our congregation. We have offered workshops on political activism and deepening our understanding of Muslim and Civil Rights history.

STAR programs are created in several ways. First, our ministers suggest them. Rev. Erica just offered a film screening and conversation about the movie *Your Fat Friend*, and Rev. Stevie is planning a program later this fall on unpacking our religious pasts.


Second, members of the STAR Committee pursue experiences that they think the congregation needs. Last year when our congregation was grieving the loss of several members, Marta's retirement, and the state of our country, we offered a workshop about grief.

We also collaborate with other committees. Last spring, after being approached by Anne Wright and Betsy Leondar-Wright, the STAR Committee and the Defending Democracy group co-sponsored a workshop called Activism that Works. In another initiative, Brian Dooley and Jessica Farman partnered with STAR and Social Justice to offer a screening and discussion of the film *Join or Die.*

The largest number of programs come from First Parish members who see a need or have a special interest they want to share with the community. This past May, Eric Segal led a walk in Boston to explore the city's rich Unitarian Universalist history. Upcoming on November 8, Anne Goodwin will lead a workshop called Finding Your Place in These Times,

for sharing ideas on how to nurture ourselves during this difficult time for our country. Eric and Anne approached the committee with these ideas, and a STAR member helped them plan and organize them.

Since the majority of STAR programs emerge from our community, we want to hear from you. If you have an idea for an adult program, please contact STAR@firstparish.info. One of us will reach out to discuss your idea and how to make it happen.

From the Parish Committee

At our annual fall retreat, the Parish Committee (ParCom) chose some themes under the lenses of change and transition:

- Inclusion and accessibility in worship
- o Communication and marketing
- Engaging volunteers



We are experimenting with having working groups made up not only of ParCom members but also other leaders at First Parish to broaden the scope of the work and include more voices. We are grateful for the hard work of Susan Moore, Amy Speare, and the other members of the Engage group.

As Rev. Jonipher mentioned in his sermon on October 19, we are all encouraged to make a friend and find a job. Please use the Engage program to discover what makes you come alive, and to share your strengths and talents.

Here are some highlights from the September and October ParCom meetings:

- The Reckoning and Repair Working Group presented a proposal to fundraise, which we unanimously approved. More details soon.
- The Defending Democracy Working Group highlighted concerns for immigrants in our community.
- The Transition Team provides us with monthly updates and welcomes comments and ideas via email, one-on-one, and in group Listening Sessions.
- The Welcoming Congregation Committee presented a proposal for renewal, taking a new name: the LGBTQIA+ Affirming Committee.
 The group received a unanimous vote of approval.

As First Parish dives deeper into the transition time and rolls up its many sleeves with Rev. Jonipher, Rev. Erica, and Rev. Stevie, we commit to listening to each other. As we try out new ways of doing things, I am reminded of the process of learning how to paint with watercolors. You only have a short time to work as the water dries.

Another way of thinking about this transition time is what Rev. Marta said about having a certain number of chips (think poker chips, not potato chips, as I did). You can only use so many chips at the beginning of a new term when you are a minister.

First Parish congregants and members may get a bit splattered with paint, but we are learning. From initial Listening Sessions hosted by the Transition Team and held in person and online in October, the congregation has made it clear that more communication, especially around process, is needed. In the coming weeks, watch for more information on these processes as we navigate together.

Raising Funds for Roxbury Youth

At our Annual Meeting last May, members of First Parish voted to acknowledge the involvement of the founders of our congregation in the institution of slavery. Since that time, the members of the Reckoning & Repair Working Group have been focusing on repair.

One of our working groups, Outreach and Partnership, has built on our historic relationship with the Unitarian Universalist Urban Ministry and its programs for teenage youth called the Roxbury Youth

Program. We have discussed with the leaders of that program ways to provide financial support for their afterschool programs, and how p First Parish members might engage with the youth.

We have launched a fundraising drive to generate funds for a reparative process with the Roxbury Youth Program. Our annual budget included \$5,000, and \$1,500 has come in from the Racial Justice Coordinating Committee. These funds represent First Parish's institutional support for such an endeavor.

In addition, members of the Reckoning & Repair Working Group have personally donated \$12,500, giving us a total amount of \$19,000 as we bring this

campaign to the congregation. After the worship service on November 9, we invite members of First Parish to contribute.

The members of the Reckoning & Repair Working Group are excited that we can do this reparative work with the Roxbury Youth Program. We are mindful that it was primarily young people who were enslaved by our religious ancestors.

Please don't miss this opportunity to engage with leaders from the Roxbury Youth Program.

New Name, Fresh Mission

The LGBTQIA+ Affirming Committee (formerly the Welcoming Congregation Committee) is pleased to provide an update on our activities and recent name change. Our new name better reflects our commitment to communicating our intentionally welcoming space for everyone of all sexual and gender identities at First Parish.

The Welcoming Congregation Committee was established by the Parish Committee in January 2023 for a three-year term. Its initial charge was to reinvigorate and maintain First Parish's Welcoming Congregation designation with the UUA and to collaborate with leadership to guide the congregation in completing the Five Practices of Welcome Renewal annually. We approach this mission through collaboration with other First Parish committees, individuals, groups, and leaders, including our clergy, religious education, Lay Ministers, Worship Associates, Social Justice, and the Alliance.

We are delighted to announce that First Parish Arlington has

renewed our designation as a Welcoming Congregation for the second year, and with the support of the LGBTQIA+ Affirming Committee we are on track for renewal in 2026. This annual commitment to renewal means we, as a community, agree to be proactive and intentional about fully welcoming and including LGBTQIA+ people, concerns, and lives in our congregational life.

Some of the ways we have been more intentional about increasing and strengthening our inclusion of LGBTQIA+ people and families over the past two years have included multiple worship services centering LGBTQIA+ concerns and lives, recognizing many special days of observance of milestones and events in the larger LGBTQIA+ communities locally and nationally throughout the year with an event and with a special second chalice on the chancel table. We



have collaborated with other committees and church groups and offered educational films and discussions, book discussions, special art exhibits, and seminars. In addition, we have made recommendations and helped First Parish offer space and financial support for LGBTQIA+ non-profit and local groups to support their efforts in providing safe spaces, peer groups, economic assistance, and social justice advocacy for those in need in the LGBTQIA+ communities.

A core and continuing goal of the LGBTQIA+ Affirming Committee is to integrate LGBTQIA+ issues and events more fully and holistically into the wider congregation. We recognize and celebrate that we are all part of a Welcoming Congregation. The role of the LGBTQIA+ Affirming Committee within our Welcoming Congregation is to encourage a deepening of our inclusion and integration of all LGBTQIA+ people in our practices of welcome.

Our practices include inward facing and outward facing activities. We help create and coordinate events and actions each year. We help find resources and offer insights and guidance on activities. We take part in large public events, such as Boston Pride 4 the People parades, and direct actions like sending hundreds of postcards of appreciation to healthcare workers who offer gender-affirming care practices. We host events such as the Transgender Day of Remembrance & Resilience on our front lawn, and we demonstrate our commitment to full LGBTQIA+ inclusion with our newly refurbished flagpole and the displaying of a Progress Pride flag on our grounds. In the last year, the Committee collaborated with the Arlington Rainbow Commission including one First Parish member joining as a commissioner. We worked with Mystic Valley Action for Reproductive Justice, the Social Justice Committee and Alliance, and supported community partners such as The Boston Alliance of LGBTQ+ Youth (BAGLY), the Resilient Sisterhood Project, and the Transforming Hearts Collective. And please admire the new Pride Quilt made by Wendy Page and donated to the amazing First Parish rotating quilt display!

We are excited to be part of strengthening our church's commitment to the full welcome and

participation of LGBTQIA+ communities and people as members of First Parish. 
