June 1, 2025 Coming of Age Credo Service Worship in the Meetinghouse Sanctuary and Online

The sun rose at 5:10am and will set at 8:15pm *in sh'allah* bringing us 15 hours, 4 minutes of sunlight, 8 minutes more than last Sunday.

The moon is waxing toward the first quarter on Monday.

At First Parish, we honor the passage from childhood towards adulthood through our Coming of Age program.

Our service will include Credo ("I Believe") statements from the Coming of Age class.

June is Pride Month for LBTGQ+ peoples.

Pride Month in June commemorates the Stonewall Uprising on June 28, 1969 at the Stonewall Inn in New York City, a turning point in the LGBTQ+ rights movement.

The first gay pride parade was held on June 28, 1970, one year after the Stonewall uprising, and it marked the beginning of Pride celebrations.

This morning a flame burns in the blue ceramic chalice on the chancel table in commemoration and in honor of Pride.
